~ In Noelle Sterne's new book, Challenges in Writing Your Dissertation: Coping With the Emotional, Interpersonal, and Spiritual Struggles (Rowman & Littlefield Education, September 2015), she helps doctoral candidates struggling with their dissertations. This book, based on Noelle's many years as dissertation coach and editor, deals with dissertation writers' often overlooked or ignored but crucial aspects that can seriously prolong their agony and delay completion.

In the fifteen chapters of *Challenges*, with a straightforward, colloquial style, Noelle is the reader's in-print coach, editor, motivator, cheerleader, professional friend, ego soother, thought facilitator, stressed student solution-supplier, and "academic nag." She offers discussions, advice, anecdotes, questions, exercises, checklists, role play scripts, and affirmative

spiritual statements to help doctoral students get through the process (with even a little pleasure) to complete their dissertations.

~ Patricia Daly-Lipe shares that her two new books have been well-received. Both are biographies and both give a personal perspective on history. *Patriot Priest* is the story of her great uncle. As a priest, he volunteered to serve the troops in WWI. When he returned to Washington, he was heralded as the "Patriot Priest of Picardy." Many of his letters are in the archives at Georgetown University. After the war, he returned to Paris to help people overcome their grief.

Ultimately, he was called down to Rome and became the first American Canon of St. Peter's representing the Knights of Malta to the Holy See. From royalty to the common man, great uncle William (Msgr William A. Hemmick) was equally congenial and this she observed first hand when she was in Rome in the 1960s. He died in 1971.

The other book is *Helen Holt, Memoir of a Servant Leader*. Helen was the first female Secretary of State of West Virginia. Then, President Eisenhower asked that she establish elder care and nursing homes all across the United States. She served under 8 Presidents in this capacity. Her son, Rush Holt, Jr., just retired after serving 8 terms in Congress representing New Jersey. Her late husband, Rush Holt, Sr., was the youngest man elected to the Senate. Sadly, he died young, leaving Helen in charge of three children. There are many stories about this amazing lady who will be 102 years old later this year.
